Most are paid by Medicaid but our Child Welfare Juvenile Justice Divisions also have contracts and pay for some days. We also recognize a 50 mile trade radius around the state borders and in 2009, 388 children were in these PRTFs (Oklahoma, Missouri and Texas)

We were exploring expanding this but it seemed to be driven more by residential providers understanding the requirements to be a PRTF. That broad discussion has shifted away from PRTFs at this time. DMH will be exploring whether DMH needs to expand PRTFs but this is in response to what we hope is a shift away from residential, an increase in the use of Treatment Family Homes/Professional Parent Homes and for those youth too severe making sure we have a limited number of highly specialized PSYCHIATRIC residential beds in each area of the state.

Nevada	1 State-run 2 Private	data not given	data not given		All PRTFs in Nevada are funded primarily by Medicaid. I only have information on the one run by our state agency. I have forwarded your request to our state Medicaid agency and will forward what they send to me. I agree that the data you gather will be helpful to many of us. My understanding is the 2 private PRTFs in NV provide care to a number of youth from other states in addition to youth from Nevada. Nevada in turn sends youth, primarily those in the JJ system under order of the court, to PRTFs in other states. A very concerning state of affairs that we are attempting to address with the lead judge.
Nebraska	2 State-run	data not given	data not given		In Nebraska, PRTFs are solely funded by Medicaid and in rare instances if a State Ward is not found medically eligible for the service but is court ordered, then it would be funded by the Child Welfare system. NE has worked hard to reduce the # of residential (out of home) placements and increase the # served in community based settings. Medicaid is currently reviewing all PRTF entities to ensure compliance with CMS IMD standards which mandate no facility with over 16 beds is eligible for Medicaid funding. Defining a PRTF and then IMD is as important as consideration could be made for the variety of residential youth providers where formal treatment may not be provided or is provided off site of residence (like treatment foster care or treatment group homes.) There are only two state run PRTFs for youth in NE - 1) only served substance dependent OJS youth who are transitioning from detention back into the community but still in need of treatment; and 2) a residential treatment for youth with sex-offender charges.

Hawaii	2 Hospital-based	\$ 900.00	35-45 days		<p>We do not have PRFT per see in Hawaii. We do have 2 "hospital based residential" programs, each licensed for 12 beds. Cost per day per individual is approximately \$900. Average census has gone from 24/days to 7-10/days in the past two years as utilization management techniques were implemented. Average length of stay thus declined dramatically as well and is now in the range of 34-45/days per hospitalization. Costs for this level of care after one year of utilization management led to a savings of \$3 million. We are looking at using these management techniques at other lower levels. We anticipate further savings, just through prudent management and in the end, it's better for the kids to get them to lower levels sooner.</p>
Maine	see narrative	data not given	data not given		<p>In Maine, we have PNMI's (Psychiatric Non-Medical Institutions). All admissions from juvenile justice, mental health and child welfare are authorized by staff that work for my office. These staff are either RNCs or LCSWs. We have developed a payment mechanism based on level of care needs (There are 2 levels for children/youth with SED and 2 levels for children with Cognitive Disabilities or ASD).</p> <p>Maine has significantly decreased the overall utilization of residential treatment facilities. In large part due to the efforts by Child Welfare to utilize Kinship care, better collaboration with children's community-based mental health providers and other permanency efforts. In the past 6 years, CW has gone from an average daily census of over 400 children in PNMI's to last weeks' low of 92.</p> <p>Children's Behavioral Health averages around 550 children annually out of the 24,000 served that utilize residential level of care.</p>
